**Role Summary:** The club is dedicated to all its athletes, from those just starting out in competitive aquatics to those currently in National training squads. All ages and abilities are given the opportunity to achieve their goals and be the best they can be.

The Head Swim Coach is the focal point of Lancaster City's entire competitive aquatics programme. This individual motivates, counsels, encourages, communicates, and instructs every athlete who is in our competitive programme - either directly or through members of the coaching team.

# Who are we looking for?

We are looking for someone who:

- Holds a minimum of a Level 2 Coaching Qualification with ideally 2 years' experience in a Level 2 Coaching position. The club is willing to support Level 2 Coaches looking to complete a Level 3 qualification.
- Is a good communicator and has excellent time management skills.
- Is highly motivated, passionate, friendly, enthusiastic and ambitious to build success.
- Holds high levels of technical knowledge and the ability to provide detailed feedback.
- Has a commitment to further developing this knowledge through relevant CPD.
- Can develop a performance pathway and is committed to athlete growth.
- Has strong leadership skills in order to successfully lead and mentor a team of coaches.
- Has the ability to inspire, motivate and support athletes of all abilities.
- Can impart the Club's ethos and drive its success by providing skilled and confident leadership to athletes, fellow coaches and club volunteers.

The successful candidate must complete a Child's Barred List Check and Enhanced DBS Check and have completed approved Swim England Safeguarding Training ahead of taking up the position.

## **Level of Commitment Required:**

This role will be split into two different aspects:

- Poolside Coaching 10.5 hours for swimming & 5.5 hours for polo plus additional time for attendance at Long Course training, Galas or Tournaments.
- Admin time spent planning, assessing and liaising with other Coaches, Team Managers and Committee Members. This will involve a weekly admin time commitment that will fluctuate as the club moves through the annual plan. Volunteer support is available for support with coaching admin.

#### What will you gain from the experience?

This is a pivotal role for the development of the club and its athletes. You will have the opportunity to set the target performance goals for the athletes and provide the plan for their achievement. You will have the opportunity to work first hand with our athletes and develop them to 'be the best they can be'.



You will gain experience in working with county, regional and national athletes as well as having the opportunity to take on a new challenge and impact the growth and development of the club.

## What is expected from a Head Coach?

- To provide a committed and professional approach towards coaching.
- To construct an annual macrocycle training programme and competition calendar in collaboration with the executive committee.
- In collaboration with the coaching team, to ensure the preparation and delivery of training session plans for all squads in line with the annual training plan and long-term goals of the club.
- To monitor progress and coordinate athlete movement between groups in conjunction with other coaches and relay this information to relevant personnel in a timely manner.
- Ensure that the appropriate level of coaching is available for all training sessions, monitoring
  the implementation of the plans and ensuring high coaching standards are consistently
  delivered.
- To lead the selection process for tournaments and galas.
- To attend appropriate competitions/tournaments and training camps, with supervised delegation to appropriately qualified Coaches and Team Managers (where necessary).
- To perform a management role and deliver regular meetings to all coaching staff.
- To follow Health and Safety Procedures and Swim England Child Protection Policy.
- To be aware of and adhere to the EAP and NOP of all training facilities.
- To forge relationships with neighbouring clubs, stakeholders and facility providers.
- To undertake relevant CPD courses to assist the development of the club and its athletes.
- To attend to other such general duties associated with the post of Head Coach.

This sets out the main aspects of the job, but it should not be taken as an exhaustive description.
